Superior of Inland Revenue I appoint my Wife Ediza Fletcher and my son
Donald (hereinafter called my Trustees) Trustees and Executors of this my
Will I bequeath all my furniture plate linen pictures and all other house-
hold effects which I shall be possessed of at my decease and also the policy
of Assurance effected on my life in the Atlas Insurance Company with all
the benefits thereof to my said Wife absolutely I devise my real estate and
I bequeath the residue of my personal estate unto my Trustees Upon trust
to permit my said Wife to receive the rents and annual income thereof
for her own use and benefit she keeping all dwellinghouses and their out-
buildings in proper repair and insured against loss or damage by fire
but if such rents and annual income be insufficient for the comfortable
requirements of my said Wife I direct that my Trustees shall apply such
part of the capital of my said real and personal estate as may be
necessary for the comfortable requirements of my said Wife And after the
death of my said Wife Upon trust to sell and convert into money such

part of my estate as does not consist of money and to stand & possessed of the proceeds of such sale and conversion and of such portion of my estate as consists of money and to divide the same equally between my children then living but if any of them be then dead or shall & have died in my lifetime leaving issue such issue shall take equally & among them the share which their Parents would have taken if living.
